While our programs may be designed primarily for men, they have families and communities at their heart. We give men the opportunity to break out of negative and restrictive roles that others have placed on them. We help them find the courage to be more available partners, fathers, and friends. We give them the tools to make changes that will lead to more equal, balanced, and positive relationships.

We invite men to consider our weekend programs as a step on the path towards building the life they want. Through vulnerability, compassion, communication, and trust, we can make our families, our communities, our world, a safe space for each and every person.
